## **Match the Adaptation**

All living things have adaptations that help them survive in their habitat. Match the photo of alligator and crocodile adaptations to the description.

- 1. Alligators and crocodiles have a third, clear eyelid (nictitating membrane) that helps them see underwater.
- 2. Mothers care for, protect, and raise their young.
- 3. Since they are cold-blooded, they bask in the sun to warm up.
- 4. They hide from potential prey by hiding most of their body underwater and keep their eyes, ears, and noses above water.
- 5. They have both webs and claws on their feet to help them move in water and on land.
- 6. Strong tails help push them through the water and even let them jump to grab prey.
